The Sanborn Maps, originally created for assessing fire insurance liability, include outlines of each building and outbuilding; the location of windows and doors; street names; street and sidewalk widths; property boundaries; fire walls; and much more. They are a highly useful resource for historical research, planning, preservation, genealogical research, sociological studies and research of urban geography.
